# All-Scale Modular Program Notes

The Division's modular layout was at the Farm Show complex on the 31st of March and the 1st of April. This two day show was sponsored by Sysco Foods of Harrisburg. They had a railroad theme for their Food and Culinary Show. The Division received a \$150 donation and a red brown colored skirt which goes completely around the 12 by 8 corner section modular setup. This color closely matched Krylon rust preventive enamel spray paint #RTA 9228 Coffee. This Krylon paint has been used to paint the legs, standoffs and the front board of the modules. During our current fiscal year 1997/1998, the modular layout has earned \$250 in donations.

The following Division members are currently

working on HO scale modules: Jim Atkinson, two 4 foot sections, a passing siding with a passenger/ freight stop and a small industrial area with two switching locations; Brian Brandt and Jeremy Griffith, three 4 foot sections, a passing siding with a stock yard, an ice house and brewery (this will also provide a unique switching problem to be worked); Fred Vealey, one 4 foot section; William Hodges, a whistle stop with a town scene; Harold Stahle and Bob Reitzel are building their own modules to our specifications, two 6 foot sections with a modified Walther's steel mill and another switching problem; and Tony Seabold, one 4 foot section.

When these completed sections are assembled into one operating layout, the Division will have a unique opportunity to earn, for any of our members who operate the layout, the necessary time credits towards their Dispatcher Achievement Program certificate.


