## September Meet at The Reading Society of Model Engineers

On September 12, 1998, the Susquehanna Division 11 will be holding its fall meet at the Reading Society of Model Engineers. The Society's layouts include a 15", 7 1/4" and a 4 3/4" gauge outdoor live steam railroads. Indoors there are O, On3, Scale and Tinplate layouts along with Explorer Post 902's HO Modular Railroad.

The outdoor motive power includes #10 the little engine that pulled trains at Carsonia Park for many years. It is gas powered. Another engine is #20, a Crown 4-4-0 steam locomotive made in Wayne, PA that runs on coal and water. Also on the roster is #370, a model of a Reading Railroad RS-3 (Baldwin AS-16) powered by a Ford Model A gasoline fueled motor. This engine was made by club members and does most of the passenger service for the Laurel Run Railroad. Of course these trains will not run in bad weather, so lets hope for a nice sunny day. For your safety be sure to wear closed-toe, low-heeled walking shoes when riding the trains.

They will be providing a lunch for us at a nominal cost. Meatball subs, hot dogs, drinks (tea, milk, soft drinks) and dessert. They will have the 18" live steam, HO Modular layout and the O and On3 layouts operational.


