We are pleased to announce the following new event for the Susquehanna Division 11.

Saturday, October 4, 2008 - Bethlehem model railroad visits

We will visit three model railroads in the Bethlehem, PA, area on Saturday, October 4th, beginning at 10:30 AM. First will be Bob Stetser's Penn Central Wilkes Barre Branch set in 1973. Second will be Ken Honer's Penn Central model railroad between Paoli and Coatesville (this model railroad includes home-made catenary over 50% of the track). We will then have several choices for lunch in downtown Bethlehem, including a converted CNJ passenger station. After lunch (approximately at 1:20 PM), we will visit the Lehigh and Keystone Valley Model Railroad Club in Bethlehem. This is an operating club encompassing over 4000 square feet. 

PENN CENTRAL WILKES BARRE BRANCH

The first model railroad we visit will be Bob Stetser's Penn Central Wilkes Barre Branch, set in October, 1975. The HO scale, point to point layout has a 240 foot long mainline using code 100 rail. Control is by Digitrax radio DCC. The model railroad replicates the 63 mile Penn Central secondary from Sunbury, PA, to Wilkes Barre, PA. It features three PC yards (Sunbury, HoneyPot, and Wilkes Barre), and one Reading yard (Sunbury) and actively interchanges with the Reading, Lehigh Valley, and the Delaware and Hudson railroads. The focus of the layout is switching, with sixteen industries to service, including a large steel mill and a large concrete plant.

The model railroad was started in January 1998, and scenery is 100% complete, with work completing in July 2006. The mainline is a single track (as appropriate for the prototype) with passing sidings. Local and mainline freight trains dominate the schedule with only limited passenger operations. There are monthly dispatcher controlled operating sessions for 12 operators using TT/TO operating rules, waybills, clearance forms, and handheld radios. Some 400 cars switched each session using approximately 30 locomotives, about 1/2 with sound. All staging is visible with one duck-under which will not be in place during this visit. Layout is dark with non-operating signals at this time.

PENN CENTRAL PAOLI - COATESVILLE Ken Honer

The second model railroad we visit will be Ken Honer's Penn Central Paoli-Coatesville mainline, set in 1973. The HO scale, point to point layout with reverse loops at each end, has a 200 foot long mainline using code 83 rail. Control is by Digitrax radio DCC. The model railroad replicates the 10 mile Penn Central mainline from Paoli, PA, to Coatesville, PA. It features three of the four main bridges, and work is being done to include the fourth. The focus of the layout is mainline running.



The model railroad was started in 2002, and scenery is 25% complete. 50% of the layout has homemade catenary which is not electrified. The mainline is a 3 or 4 tracks as appropriate for the prototype. There is one yard representing Thorndale. Freight trains dominate the schedule with some passenger operations. It is not set up for operating sessions, but for one man running.

LEHIGH AND KEYSTONE VALLEY MODEL RAILROAD CLUB

After a break for lunch, the final model railroad will be the Lehigh and Keystone Valley Model Railroad Club. The club features a 4,000+ square foot operating model railroad. For the past 10 years, the members have been working on duplicating the paths of the Lehigh Valley and Reading Railroads from West Portal, NJ through the Lehigh Valley to Reading, PA. The model railroad features the Lehigh Valley Railroad Stations in Easton and Bethlehem, PA, and the Bethlehem Steel and Allentown Freight Yard with 2 working humps.





The layout operates on NCE DCC and Rail-Lynx with many of the engines running sound systems. The club has two website at:

BOB STETSER DIRECTIONS

We will meet at Bob Stetser's home at 10:30 AM. Further directions will be provided at that point.

Directions are given from I-78 just east of Allentown, PA.

Exit I-78 (exit number 60) at US 309 South towards Quakertown. Immediately exit US 309 to the right onto the cloverleaf to Center Valley Parkway. Turn left on Center Valley Parkway at the light. Travel 2.5 miles until Center Valley Parkway terminates at PA 378. Turn left on PA 378 and travel northbound 1 mile to Black River Road. Hess gas station on the left, empty lot on the right. Turn right on Black River Road, travel under I-78 about 300 yards and turn left on to Alice Dr. Travel on Alice Dr to the first stop sign about 150 yards and turn right on to Willowbrook. Travel on Willowbrook about 100 yards to first left on to Amherst. Travel 150 yards to second left onto Franklin CT. WATCH THE BIG DIP IN ROADWAY JUST BEFORE LEFT TURN ON TO FRANKLIN.


