


From the Superintendent's Desk – Barry Schmitt

Happy 2016 to All!

However, to successfully achieve that goal we need to hear from you; otherwise, the choices are up to the few who do their best to develop programs for all our members.

If you have any questions about a specific event kindly contact the appropriate event project officer.

Event 1: February 20 – Mechanicsburg PA

Title: Winter Meeting.

Project Officer: Ron Smith (rsmith@susquehannanmra.org).

<u>Location</u>: Grace United Methodist Church, 216 South Market Street, Mechanicsburg PA (same location as last

February)

Schedule: See the detailed schedule in the feature article on page 9.

<u>Comments:</u> All attendees are requested to bring a model for the Model Showcase clinic. It can be your pride and joy, something under construction, a new purchase, and in any scale – in short, anything related to model railroading and will fit though the door. All will be on display throughout the morning program, and each model owner will have up to 5 minutes to describe your item. This is not a judging event - it's simply an opportunity to share some aspect of this great hobby with your fellow modelers. See John Wissinger's article on page 9.

Event 2: April 16 – Blue Ridge Summit PA.

Title: Blue Ridge Summit Mini-Con.

Project Officer: Barry Schmitt (bschmitt@susquehannanmra.org or 717-877-1810).

<u>Location:</u> Blue Ridge Fire & Rescue, 13063 Monterey Lane, Blue Ridge Summit PA. The fire hall is directly across the street from Mainline Hobby Supply.

Schedule: 9AM-4PM with informal clinics 9AM-1PM and formal clinics from 1PM-4PM.

<u>Comments:</u> This will be the 4th mini-con put on by Mainline Hobby Supply. In the past they were sponsored by the NMRA South Mountain Division (SMD). However, this year it will be a joint event sponsored by both the SMD and your Susquehanna Division (SD). The Apr event will follow the proven plan of previous mini-cons. The morning will be devoted to "informal" clinics, modular layouts, and a few vendors. The afternoon program will include "formal" clinics. Two of the three formal clinics will include Steam Into History Tourist Railroad and TCS Wow Sounds. Lunch will be available on site inside the fire hall. And of course the Mainline Hobby Supply shop will be open all day for your shopping enjoyment.

The morning "informal" clinics include a variety of interesting topics. Planned topics are: Passenger Car Details, Scenery from Your Backyard, Glue-Shell Scenery, Casting Rocks-Wet, Casting Rocks-Dry, Structure Painting and Making Window Glass Using Crystal Clear, Model Railroading on a Budget, Figure and Vehicle-Painting along with Weathering, Layout Design, Layout Construction and Design, Frugal (Cheap) Modeling, and Styrene Structure Building. If you would like to present an "informal" clinic contact the project officer by January 20.

The third afternoon formal clinic will be a unique interactive program where the theme will be, "You should model this railroad and here's why." The first clinic segment will include a series of 3 to 5-minute presentations by members of both divisions who will speak on behalf of the railroad of their choice. Each speaker will advocate his or her railroad and include some pictures of the prototype, model, or both. Prototype railroad presentations are not required – speakers are also encouraged to advocate freelance or proto-freelance layouts or other interesting suggestions. After the presentations are completed there will be a very interesting "round table" discussion led by SMD member and moderator Bob Johnson. Bob will present questions to the speakers – some known to the speakers for their advanced planning and a few surprise questions to keep the program lively and spontaneous. Bob will also accept questions from the audience. This will certainly be a most interesting clinic and be a lot of fun. So don't leave early – plan to stay until the afternoon program is over.

Event 3: May 14, Quakertown PA.

Title: Eastern Sub Division Program.

Project Officer: Howard Oakes (hoakes@susquehannanmra.org).

<u>Location and Schedule:</u> The program will include morning clinics in the Quakertown PA Train Station at 15 Front Street and afternoon layout visits in the area. The exact details of the program are still being developed. If you would like to offer your model railroad empire to the afternoon layout visit program please contact Howard. And remember a final fully sceniced layout is not required - many modelers enjoy viewing a layout under construction. There are several eateries close to the station for lunch and the well-stocked and friendly J&D Whistle Stop Hobbies shop is just across the tracks on East Broad Street and will be open until 5PM. The detailed event plan will be presented in the March Sidetracks.

Event 4: June 26, Rahns PA.

Title: Live Steam Day.

Project Officer: Dan Horting (dhorting@susquehannanmra.org).

<u>Location:</u> PA Live Steamers (PLS), Rahns PA - approximately 7 miles north of Valley Forge.

Schedule: 11AM-Approximately 4PM.

<u>Comments:</u> The program will begin with an introduction covering the extensive history, construction, and operation of the railroad. The PLS operates a variety of live steam and diesel equipment in 1.5", 1.0", 3/4" scale, and 1 gauge on an elevated track. Train rides will be provided to those who wish to take a loop around their extensive grounds. All facets of this very specialized segment of model railroading will be on display along with detailed presentations. Directions as well as the detailed agenda will be provided in the March Sidetracks.

Event 5: September 17-18, Blue Ridge Summit PA.

Title: Mainline Hobby Weekend Layout Open Houses.

Project Officer: Ron Smith (rsmith@susquehannanmra.org).

Location: Mainline Hobby Supply, 15066 Buchannan Trail East, Blue Ridge Summit PA.

Schedule: 9AM-4PM Saturday (17th) and 11AM-4PM Sunday (18th).

<u>Comments:</u> Our Division has sponsored this event for many years. Although Mainline Hobby is not physically in our assigned Division area, they are just across the Adams County line which is our southern-most county. More importantly they have always provided excellent support to members throughout our Division and particularly those residing in our southern counties.

In May we will contact layout owners within our Division area who participated last year and request your continued support for our 2016 program. If you would like to open your layout for the 2016 event kindly contact our project officer. The primary requirement for participation is being within an hour or so ride from Blue Ridge Summit. There are also many layouts within the South Mountain Division area that will be open. Free map booklets to all layouts will be available both days at the Mainline Hobby registration desk.

There were 25 layouts open last year with over 250 visitors. All popular scales are represented – from N to G. We had 10 layouts from our Susquehanna Division area. A final key attraction at this event - Mainline Hobby will be open each day and offering several special discounts during the event.

Event 6: September 30 and October 1, 2016, Central Susquehanna Valley and Allentown/Lehigh Valley.

Schedule: In each area, one layout on Friday evening (Sep 30) and two layouts on Saturday (Oct 1).

Model Showcase


