

In October of this year our Division will be hosting the Mid-Eastern Region convention, The Susquehannock. The convention website, www.mer2017.org will detail many of the activities, with many more to be posted. What, then, are the opportunities I may be talking about?

First, of course, is the educational opportunity the convention provides, but there is more. There are a myriad of opportunities for you to become involved in the convention and earn Achievement award points while you are at it. For example, those presenting a clinic at the convention will earn points toward their Model Railroad Author award, and if they present twice, the second and any subsequent earns points toward Association Volunteer. Volunteer points are earned for things like hosting an open house, displaying a modular railroad, judging the model contest and more. Members of the host committee are earning points at the rate of one time unit per month.

How does one go about getting involved? The convention committee is already at work creating the many activities that constitute a convention, and there are things in place now to ensure a very enjoyable event. But later, when the convention finally arrives, there will be many areas in need of arms and legs to support the activities. Examples include tour guides, technical support for clinics, hosts for the white elephant sale or run items at the live auction, plus many more. We even need someone to provide background music for the hospitality event on Thursday evening of the convention. If you have the musical skills for this, please volunteer. Maybe you would be willing to volunteer to host in the auction room? Or, does one of the other areas interest you more?

Becoming a volunteer is simple! Contact me or any of the other chairmen involved, and you will be a part of the event. Brian Kampschroer is the inside activities Chair. Dan Horting chairs the Outside activities committee. Want to open your railroad for a visit? Contact Harry Haddon or Jerry Britton. Want to do a clinic? Contact Barry Schmitt, Clinic Chairman. Want to work the Auction or White Elephant sale? Contact Howard Oakes. Do you love to meet new people? Brian will welcome the support at the registration table to greet folks as they arrive and receive their package. Are you a "techie"? Dave Collison, our webmaster, can use you. Are you a good writer? Publicity chair Tim Himmelberger could use some help writing and editing much of the information necessary to describe the events to attendees (Hello, Author points).

The point of all this is, GET INVOLVED! The convention will provide significant financial support to our division and we all need to volunteer to support the efforts of your committee to assure the success of the event. If you have never attended a convention before, you have a treat in store. It is a four day immersion in model railroading. The dates for the convention are October 12 - 15, 2017. It would be nice to see not only a variety of award winners, but to see our members get the recognition they deserve. We have many excellent modelers in the division, and we want to see all of you participate. Let's show the rest of the divisions just how good we really are!


You may enter as many models as you wish, and in any of the categories. Some of the less popular categories are traction, caboose, passenger cars and MOW. Maybe you build and enter these and walk away with a first place in addition to a merit award. Please remember, if you are working toward a master builder award, several AP categories have a required number of merit awards. This would be an excellent opportunity to try and earn one or more of them to send you on your way.

Part of entry is the required paperwork describing your model in each of the judged areas – namely construction, detail, conformity, finish and lettering, and scratchbuilding. You can find the forms on line on the NMRA web site. If you need help or if you have any questions please contact Bob Charles, our Division AP chairman, rcharles@aol.com Plans and pictures are invaluable in assisting judges in understanding what you have accomplished.

I would encourage each and every one of you to seriously consider preparing a model for the contest room. Even if you do not earn a merit award you will learn in what areas you need to improve. That is also an important part of becoming a better modeler. I look forward to seeing models from all of you.







Also, your model does not have to be finished – model railroaders always enjoy seeing projects in their all-important building stage. Each modeler will be provided up to five-minutes to tell their story; however, giving such a presentation is not required. And remember, this is not a model contest – it is simply an opportunity to see and enjoy what is special to our area modelers. In the afternoon you will have the opportunity to visit three great model railroads:

- 1. The Elizabethtown and Masonic Village Model Railroad Club. This stand- alone model railroad building is located just across the highway from the Patton Conference Center. His large empire is located in a dedicated and expertly finished model railroad man cave which in itself is worth the visit. Roman's layout is not handicap accessible.

March 18 End of Winter Gathering

Our End of Winter event will be held at the St Andrews Presbyterian Church at 600 South 12th Street in Lebanon. The church is located 0.6 miles south of Cumberland Street/US-422. Use the parking lots at the side and back of the church. Entrance to the Snyder Hall meeting room is the stairwell off the back (east) parking lot. The facility is handicap accessible; however, prior arrangements must be arranged with the event project officer (John Wissinger at jww99nmra@hotmail.com) to have someone meet you at the front door.

The meeting room doors will open at 8:45 AM, and morning munchies will be served. The introductory program runs from 9:00-9:30 AM and includes a welcome, introduction of guests, review of the event schedule, and updates to the Oct 12-15 **Susquehannock** Convention by Superintendent Tim Himmelberger. At 9:30 we will then take a 15-minute break for coffee, donuts, and clinic setup.

From 9:45-10:45 AM, member John Wissinger MMR will present a clinic titled How To Build A Turnout To Fit Where A Commercial Turnout Will Not Fit. We have often encountered spaces on our model railroads where a commercial turnout will not fit because the space is too small or the intersecting track is at too much of an angle. The only way to fit in a turnout is hand-lay or scratch-build one. You have probably never tried to do that and are reluctant to try "because it is so hard." John will show you an easy way to build a non-standard turnout without jigs. If you can solder, you can do this. John developed this method in the 1960s and has built more than 50 turnouts since that time. Come and watch this PowerPoint clinic to show an easy method on how to do it.

At the end of John's clinic we will take another break until 11:00 AM when we will then present the Model Showcase clinic. All attendees are requested to bring their pride and joy model that will be on display throughout the morning program. During this clinic each modeler will be provided up to 5-minutes to talk about their model; however, such a talk is not required if you feel uncomfortable speaking before the group. There are only 2 restrictions on what you can bring and display – it must be model railroad related and it must fit through the entry door. Otherwise, what you show is up to you – an engine, new purchase, structure, module, or something under construction. So start searching your layout, workbench, or storage area for something that is special to you. At the end of the morning program maps to the afternoon layouts will be handed out.

The morning program will end about Noon where attendees have lunch on your own at one of the many nearby restaurants. The following Lebanon area layouts will then be open for your viewing from 2:00-4:00 PM: Tim Himmelberger and John Wissinger.

Proposed Changes to our By-Laws

The following is a proposed amendment to our Division By-Laws. This was discussed and approved at the last Board of Directors meeting. Please read it carefully. We are a group of non-lawyers making changes to a legal document - a very dangerous situation. There are 3 sections listed below. The first is the By-Laws as they now exist. The second section is marked highlighting the area of concern. The third section shows the proposed new version to the By-Laws. This is follow by the rational for the revision. The information presented below will also be presented during our annual business meeting in February. The officers and directors will receive any comments and editorial suggestions from members of the Division until February 18th. (This is one week after the annual business meeting in Elizabethtown.) It will then be posted in the March – April *Sidetracks* with the voting instructions.

Existing By-Law

Current

ARTICLE VI Board of Directors

Section 1. Officers

- A. Officers of the Susquehanna Division shall consist of: the Superintendent (with duties as president), Assistant Superintendent (with duties as vice-president), and Chief Clerk (with duties as secretary and treasurer). They shall be elected for a two year term in the spring of even-numbered years, holding office from July 1 of that same year to June 30 of the second year.
- B. The Chief Clerk shall keep an account of all funds received and dispersed, render a proper accounting for these funds at the annual business meeting, and make books available for an annual audit by a properly qualified member of the Susquehanna Division 11, as appointed by the Superintendent. Audits will also be conducted at the departure of the Chief Clerk. The Chief Clerk shall be Bonded by Division 11 in regards to his or her activities as the Division Treasurer. The bond shall cover any and/or properties and monies held by the Treasurer.
- C. The Superintendent shall appoint a qualified replacement to fill out the unexpired term of any Board of Directors position subject to the approval of the Board of Directors. In the event the Superintendent office is vacated, the Assistant Superintendent shall either fill out the unexpired term or appoint a replacement subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.
- D. No Officer or Board member may hold more than one office at the same time. If elected or appointed to a new position, said election constitutes a resignation from the former position.
- E. Any Officer or Board member may be removed from Office by a two-thirds vote of the members responding to a ballot to be conducted by mail. This ballot is to take place upon written complaint to any Board of Directors member of ten (10) or more Division members expressing misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance of the office.

Section 2. The Board of Directors

The Board of Directors shall consist of seven (7) members: the three elected Officers, the Past Superintendent (until he is replaced by the next Past Superintendent), and three (3) directors, and will be chaired by the Superintendent. The directors shall be elected for a two year term in the spring of odd-numbered years, holding office from July 1 of that same year to June 30 of the second year. In the event the Past Superintendent is unwilling, ineligible, or unable to be a member of the Board, a fourth director shall take the seventh board position in accordance with Article VI,

Proposed Changes to our By-Laws

Section 1, Paragraph C. The Board of Directors shall hold legal title to all Susquehanna Division 11 property and monies in trust for its members. Each member has one vote at a Board meeting or a General meeting. All members must be members of the NMRA and reside in the Division. All members must be at least twenty one (21) years of age and be eligible for bonding as may be required by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Committees

Superintendent shall create Committees as needed and shall appoint Committee Chairpersons as required. The Superintendent shall also disband committees and dismiss members as necessary and require reports from committee chairs as necessary. There shall be a standing Achievement Program committee.

Key Concerns with Current Policy:

Section 2. The Board of Directors:

The Board of Directors shall consist of seven (7) members: the three elected Officers, the Past Superintendent (until he is replaced by the next Past Superintendent), and three (3) directors, and will be chaired by the Superintendent. The directors shall be elected for a two year term in the spring of odd-numbered years, holding office from July 1 of that same year to June 30 of the second year. In the event the Past Superintendent is unwilling, ineligible, or unable to be a member of the Board, a fourth director shall take the seventh board position in accordance with Article VI, Section 1, Paragraph C. The Board of Directors shall hold legal title to all Susquehanna Division 11 property and monies in trust for its members. Each member has one vote at a Board meeting or a General meeting. All members must be members of the NMRA and reside in the Division. All members must be at least twenty one (21) years of age and be eligible for bonding as may be required by the Board of Directors.

Proposed ARTICLE VI, Section 2 Rewrite:

The Board of Directors shall consist of seven (7) *elected* members: the three elected Officers and four (4) directors, and will be chaired by the Superintendent. *The Past Superintendent will serve as an honorary, non-voting member of the Board of Directors until replaced by the next Past Superintendent*. The directors shall be elected for a two year term in the spring of odd-numbered years, holding office from July 1 of that same year to June 30 of the second year. The Board of Directors shall hold legal title to all Susquehanna Division 11 property and monies in trust for its members. Each member has one vote at a Board meeting or a General meeting. All members must be members of the NMRA and reside in the Division. All members must be at least twenty one (21) years of age and be eligible for bonding as may be required by the Board of Directors.

A. <u>Rationale:</u> Our fundamental belief is that only elected Division members should be voting members of the Board of Directors. If the past Super was replaced by the vote of the membership in a contested election where others were on the ballot the members have spoken and desire a change in Division leadership. Having the defeated Super serve as a voting member of the BOD does not logically follow the desires of the membership. The second reason serving as Division Superintendent is not and / or should not be a "lifetime" position.
