

Model Showcase



Recap of the Crossroads of the MER Mid-Eastern Region, NMRA 2018 Convention October 4 - 7, 2018

I attended the MER convention held in Rockville, Maryland from Thursday night through Saturday afternoon. What follows is a recap of the events and activities I attended along with layout photos.

The convention at the Hilton had 5 rooms; 3 for clinics, 1 for the white elephant/door prize items and 1 contest room. There was also a large banquet room filled with HO modules which ran throughout the convention. I did not participate in any of the 6 operation call boards which allow you to operate on someone's railroad for a few hours. Nor did I have time for the two prototype tours offered. As you can gather there is a lot to do at a convention and no one can do it all. You must pick your interests and go from there.

The convention hosted 50 clinics with generally 3 clinics being presented at the same time. I was able to attend 5 one-hour clinics. I'll give a summary in case these clinics are presented at a future convention you might attend.

Vinegar, Pickles and Railroads – Rod Vance, MMR

Modeling the pickle and vinegar industries from the 1880's to the 1970's. Structures and facilities used in processing these products and the special railcars used for transportation.

Small Layouts and Space Saving Ideas – Mat Chibbaro


Mat has written two books on 'Model Railroading in Small Spaces'. Ideas covered include sectional, modular, bookcase, fold-up, roll-away, dual use, interchangeable inserts and layouts in furniture.

Prototypes for the Athearn 40' Boxcar & Athearn Boxcar Enhancements – Ben Hom

The first clinic covered the prototypes used for the Athearn car. The second clinic covered how to improve the detail on the boxcar. He estimated there were over 1 million blue box cars manufactured so there are plenty out there for experimentation at a low price.

One Modeler's Approach to Building a Layout – Andrew Dodge

This clinic explored concepts, design considerations, prototype or freelance, planning, materials, environmental issues and operations.



I spent Thursday night and most of Friday driving to 9 layouts in northern Virginia, D.C. and Maryland. I spent a lot of time in D.C. traffic, but it was worth it as all layouts were well done and scenery was complete. There were 33 layouts open for viewing during the convention. The nine visited were:

D&D and the Allisonville Short Line (HO) – Bill Day has several dozen fine scale animation scenes including working coal elevators, bascule bridges, water plugs, ore lifts, cranes and warehouse doors all accompanied by the appropriate sounds!

Oahu Sugar Company (Fn3) – Nick Kalis models Hawaii in 1944 in this 1/20 scale railroad. A few scenes are military related and the rest are sugar cane growing and production.

Shepard Branch, Potomac & Patuxent Railroad, and Ohio River & Western Railroad (O) – Ken Nesper has 3 O scale railroads in one; O scale, Lionel and On3 with most scenes resembling Baltimore and D.C.

Piedmont Southern Railroad (HO) – Dale Latham model railroad is breath taking as you enter the room. His layout was featured in Great Model Railroads in 2009.

P & D Railroad (HO) – Paul Hutchins models the current era mixing CSX, Conrail and Norfolk Southern. He has a large container yard and the layout is illuminated for night operations.


Westmoreland Railroad (HO) – Bill Demas' bridge railroad is operated point to point. The setting is eastern Pennsylvania with appropriate names and plenty of coal.

Eureka and South Pass Railroad (HO) – Alex Belida models Nevada in the early 1900's. This highly detailed layout has several buildings with complete interiors and lighting.

Baltimore & Ohio Monongah Division (HO) – Dean Ripple has set his railroad in West Virginia in the mid-1950's. He models the Buckhannon area with an interchange with the Western Maryland.

Clinch Valley Lines (HO) – Roger Sekera models western Virginia with a mix of the L&N, Norfolk & Western, Clinchfield and Southern. He uses a fast clock during operations with car cards and waybills to route the cars.

I visited the white elephant room twice and managed to pick up a few building and accessories for a small price. I also spent time checking out the large HO modular set up. A thoroughly enjoyable weekend.




