

Fully 62% of the judged models achieved Merit Awards with 14 of them scoring 100 points or higher. Division member, Jerry Lauchle scored Best in Show with his O.W. Houts & Son & O'Neills Fabrication online display. It scored 120 out of a possible 125 points. Congratulations, Jerry!

And while on the subject of contests, we have many exceptional modelers in our division and region. Yet, the contest results for the National contest showed not a single entry from our division. Why? Yes, Texas is a long way to go, and Long Beach, CA for the 2024 National convention is even farther away. But I'll ask right now; are any of you planning on going to Long Beach next year? If you are, would you be willing to take the models of other division members to enter by proxy in the contest? (Contact me personally; I have at least three scratchbuilt steam locomotives.) Some of our members have already won Merit Awards on the regional level. You deserve recognition on a national level. Entering a model on the national level may inspire others to do the same. And because of national level judges, their comments can help you improve your modeling.

Regarding our December 9<sup>th</sup> Division meeting, we now have two model railroads who will open their layouts that day; Bob Charles' and Randy Watts' layouts will be open. Directions to both will be given at the meet. I hope you will enjoy my clinic on powering a Funaro & Camerlengo Plymouth rod-connected gas-mechanical "critter." Remember also that we'll be having a *FREE* raffle of items you no longer need or want. Already we have two brand new freight cars courtesy of Bowser, several years of <u>Trains</u> magazines in binders, and other hobby items. Please, please, please bring more.



Plans are progressing for more division meetings in 2024. I'm in the process of arranging a meet at Cornwall Manor, and our February meet will be a joint one with the Philadelphia Division. Last year they came to our meet; watch for details on attending their meet.

Starting with this issue, there will be a series of reports on various activities from the convention.


For this issue (Part 1), the focus will be modular railroads and specialized modules. These displays were exhibited in the reception area adjacent to the registrar's table. Visitors were quite surprised at the extremely high level of craftsmanship characterized by each hobbyist.

# **MER Altoona Convention Report - Part 1 (continued)**



Mike DeSensi, a member of the MCR Division 2, brought two N-Scale modular layouts to our convention and were displayed in the main convention open area. He was assisted by his 30+ year friend and MCR Division member Jim Hofer. The above layout is a 2.5' x 6' T-TRAK modular layout, and the photo features the Santa Fe's San Bernardino Passenger Station. It is no longer an available craftsman laser kit from Red River Models. It took more than 30-hours to build along with many more hours devoted to painting, detailing, and lighting. It won First Place in the T-TRAK category at the 2019 Youngstown OH MCR Convention.




The above opposite side layout photo features a double T-TRAK module titled Downtown and is one of Mike's first modules. It depicts an oil supply depot at track level and a raised large city level with lots of transition era details. Mike used the Woodland Scenics Just Plug line of lighting. A truck transfer structure with both interior and exterior details is visible. To the left of the elevated city is a module simply labeled "Santa Fe #3 Standard Depot" built from an American Model Builders laser kit.

# **MER Altoona Convention Report - Part 1 (continued)**



The above freelance West View and Santa Fe N-Scale modular layout depicts a wholly owned subsidiary of the Santa Fe and is located in the bountiful San Joaquin Valley of California in 1945. Steam is predominant but a new diesel makes occasional appearances. The main city is West View with lots of rail served industries. Mike started construction during the COVID 2020 lockdown, it is 2' x 4', uses all Atlas snap track with Caboose Industries ground throws for switch control, and can be powered by either DC or DCC. Mike earned third place in the 2021 Walthers National Model Railroad Build Off and used the layout to earn his NMRA Golden Spike Achievement Award.



The other half of the West View and Santa Fe Railroad contains the small town of Amelia. Rail served industries include RS Dee Manufacturing on the left and an icing house and citrus packing house on the right. The backgrounds photos for both layouts are from Walthers Instant Horizons line mounted on removable plastic sheets.
